



I am pleased to notify you that I was able to find information in my records on your 1876 Winchester musket, serial # 28903.

This musket was issued on December 14, 1895 to a Jano Ouderkirk who was 52 years of age, was an American and he was a carpenter. He was issued 50 rounds of ammunition, a belt and a cap. He was a member of the Company Upper Makiki, number 16, division 1. This information is on page 2 of the records.

As you are aware, almost half of the production of '76 muskets went to Hawaii. Some of them had saber bayonet lugs, cleaning rods, and some were marked CGH for Citizens Guard Hawaii, stamped in the stock, but not all.
