MAKE: Winchester SERIAL NO. 46108

MODEL: 1876 Carbine CAL. .45-75

This carbine was issued to the North West Mounted Police and formed part of Order Number 22020, shipped August 1, 1885.


The following information was located:

On charge to "G" Division {Fort Saskatchewan} on January 25, 1897.

Documentation was located which showed the carbine issued to the following members. As near as could be determined, they were part of "G" Division during the years indicated.

In one undated document, serial number 46108 had a line through it. In the next column, under the heading "To Whom Told Off" {where the name of the member normally appeared} was the word "Militia". It was assumed this carbine was transferred to the Militia, either on a loan basis or permanently, sometime after 1902. Unfortunately, no other documentation was located which provided any additional information on the Militia connection.
